Awarding the title of Executive in Residence to Mr. Roland Pampel by Eastern Connecticut State University

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Board Resolution #82-120, the title of "_____ in Residence" may be awarded from time to time to recognize individuals of prominence in their chosen field who have agreed to make significant contributions to the instructional programs of a university. The award of such a title allows a University to recognize significant contributions made to students, faculty and the university community by such individuals. These appointments are expected to be honorary in nature, although compensation is allowable, limited to a specified term and do not feature eligibility for tenure or other privileges normally authorized for academic appointments.

ANALYSIS

The nomination by Eastern Connecticut State University of Mr. Roland Pampel for the Executive in Residence title seems eminently justifiable. By credentials and experience he seems likely to make significant contributions to ECSU's academic programs and will serve without compensation for a term limited to academic year 2000-01. This title is appropriate for the role Mr. Pampel is expected to perform.

CHANCELLOR'S RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Mr. Roland Pampel be awarded the title of Executive in Residence at Eastern Connecticut State University.
