
WHEREAS, Periodic reviews of low enrollment degree programs are conducted by the universities in the Connecticut State University System as requested by the Commissioner of the Department of Higher Education, and

WHEREAS, A review of programs by Central Connecticut State University has resulted in a request to discontinue the Bachelor of Science program Composites and Polymer Materials, and

WHEREAS, The appropriate University review procedures have been completed and the President of Central Connecticut State University has certified that all currently enrolled students have had appropriate opportunity to graduate, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees for the Connecticut State University System approves the termination of the Bachelor of Science program in Composites and Polymer Materials at Central Connecticut State University and requests that the Board of Governors for Higher Education be notified of this action.

Discontinuance of the Bachelor of Science degree program in Composites and Polymer Materials at Central Connecticut State University

BACKGROUND

The program in Composites and Polymer Materials at Central Connecticut State University was licensed by the Department of Higher Education. However, it was never accredited and no extension was granted by DHE. One student was listed as active and has been transferred to another program.

ANALYSIS

The Faculty Senate has recommended the termination of the Bachelor of Science program in Composites and Polymer Materials at Central Connecticut State University. The President of Central has reviewed and approved this recommendation and has certified that there are no students currently enrolled in this program

CHANCELLOR'S RECOMMENDATION

Approve the discontinuance of the above named program at Central Connecticut State University, effective at the end of the 2003-04 academic year.
