RESOLUTION

Concerning

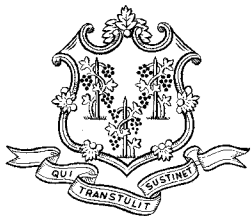
Principles Supported by the Trustees in the

Development of Collective Bargaining

April 6, 1973

The professional staff employed by the Trustees, including members of the teaching faculty, ought to have the right to decide whether or not they desire to participate in collective bargaining. If the choice is for collective bargaining, the law ought to incorporate the following principles.

1. **The professional staff employed by the Trustees ought to form a single bargaining unit.** This bargaining unit ought to bargain independently and not in association with any other group of state employees.
2. Bargaining negotiations ought to be a responsibility of the Trustees. However, in negotiating financial matters the Trustees should be joined by a representative or representatives of the Governor and the legislature. All financial agreements ought to require approval of the representative or representatives of the Governor and the legislature.
