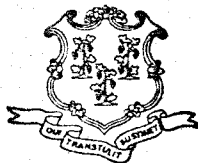

At its meeting Tuesday, December 3, 1974, the Subcommittee on Coordination of Planning acted on the Criminal Justice Administration program at WesConn in the following wording:

In consideration of the assurances adopted by the Planning Committee of the Board of Trustees for State Colleges at its meeting of November 21, 1974, the Subcommittee on Coordination of Planning (SCP) recommends to the Commission for Higher Education favorable approval of the Western Connecticut State College Bachelor of Science degree program in Criminal Justice Administration with the stipulation that until the Western Connecticut program in Criminal Justice Administration has completed the full four-year cycle of operation, barring unusual circumstances as determined by the Commission for Higher Education, no additional graduate or undergraduate programs or satellite activities in Criminal Justice Administration will be approved by the Commission for Higher Education at another state college.

The SCP further noted that because of its proximity to the University of New Haven, the development of a Criminal Justice program at Southern Connecticut State College, so long as a major one exists at the University of New Haven, would be unnecessarily duplicative and costly.

S T A T E M E N T

The Board of Trustees for State Colleges through President Haas, its Executive Staff and its Planning Committee, has consulted with President Kaplan of the University of New Haven relative to SCP approval of the Criminal Justice Administration program for Western Connecticut State College. The central issue remaining is one of possible replication of the program, once approved, at one or more of the State Colleges.

The Trustees, by way of reassurance to the University of New Haven, offer a factual statement to the effect that SCP approval of the Criminal Justice Administration program at Western is a singular act. At present the other three colleges do not have plans for such a program, nor do they see any realistic prospect of offering such a program in the next 4 or 5 years. If, however, circumstances should change, and the need for or the advisability of offering such a program should arise in one or more of the regions served by the State Colleges, the Trustees will use the state-wide procedure for program coordination and approval operational at that time.

Therefore, acting in behalf of the Trustees, and under their instructions, I move the approval by SCP of the Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice Administration at Western Connecticut State College.

MOTION:

The Board of Trustees for State Colleges through President Haas, its Executive Staff and its Planning Committee, has consulted with President Kaplan of the University of New Haven relative to SCP approval of the Criminal Justice Administration program for Western Connecticut State College. 
