

This is to request that you present to the Personnel Committee of the Board of Trustees my recommendation for the establishment of the position of Dean of the School of Technology of Central. This position should be established at the Academic Dean salary level of Salary Groups 34 and 35.

This position of Dean will replace the current position of Director of the Division of Technology. That position will be abolished as soon as the position of Dean is filled.

The Dean of the School of Technology will serve as the Chief Academic Officer for this School within the college. The incumbent in the position will report directly to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and will be a member of the Council of Deans which includes the other academic deans in the institution.

We are all very pleased at Central that the Board has approved the establishment of the School of Technology and look forward to the leadership that will be provided for this new School through the Office of the Dean.
