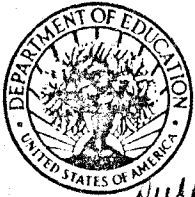

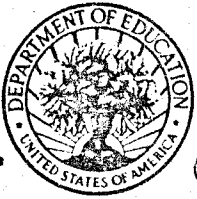

I would like to call the Department's attention to three applications for the College Housing Program under Title IV of the Housing Act of 1950. I fully support these proposed projects, as they would enhance the quality of both residential and academic life on the respective campuses.

Application CT810828047A, for student housing at Western Connecticut State College, Danbury Connecticut, is of particular importance to me. As a lifelong resident of Danbury and a former instructor at Western Connecticut State College, I know that this new facility would be a great addition to that campus. Both the State Legislature and the Board of Trustees of the College have authorized substantial funds for the project, and construction is expected to begin soon. The addition of federal support for this project is thus of critical importance at this stage of the preparations.

Thank you for considering these applications, and I hope you will contact me if I can be of further assistance to you.

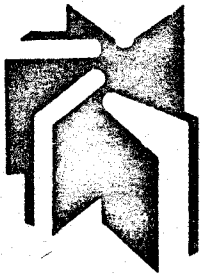


Gentlemen:

The State of Connecticut Board of Trustees of the State Colleges will construct the proposed college housing upon land owned by the State of Connecticut in fee simple in the towns of Danbury, New Haven and Willimantic. The applicants' fee simple interest is sufficient to insure the undisturbed use and possession of the facilities for not less than the useful life of the facilities or 50 years, whichever is longer.

The State of Connecticut Board of Trustees of the State Colleges has the necessary legal authority to:

- a. Finance, construct, rehabilitate, purchase or maintain the proposed facilities;
- b. Apply for and receive the proposed loan; and
- c. Pledge the full faith and credit of the State of Connecticut as security for the proposed loan.
