
WHEREAS, Funds are available for this purpose, and

Dear Mike:

The plaintiff has accepted the offer of \$17,000 we made to settle the above-captioned matter through the office of the magistrate on November 23, 1982. It includes attorney fees. I am holding a release in escrow pending acceptance by the Board of the agreement.

The sum of \$17,000 will resolve the outstanding dispute totally, cluminating with a withdrawal of the action with prejudice in accordance with Rule 41 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

As you will recall, this was the matter in which officials of the college responded to an Equal Employment Opportunity Commission investigation by stating that the reason the plaintiff was not hired was not because of her race, but because of her sex. It was our position she was not qualified for the employment she sought at the college in any event. The plaintiff demanded a total of \$166,000. A copy of their
