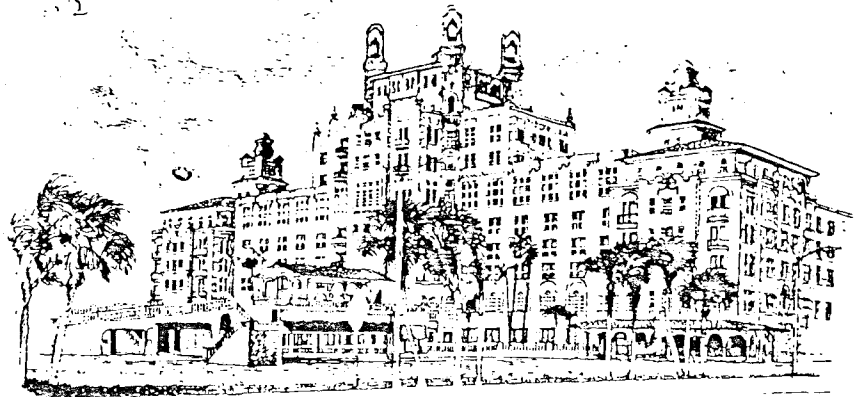

## OVERVIEW OF THE CONFERENCE

For the fifth consecutive year, the Stetson University College of Law presents a national conference focusing upon current, unresolved legal issues of vital importance to the higher education community. As in past years, the conference will bring together college and university administrators, attorneys, and representatives of government to discuss legal and policy concerns shared by members of each of these constituent groups.

We are pleased that the American Council on Education, and the National Association of College and University Attorneys again join as co-sponsors of the conference. This year, the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators joins as a co-sponsor of the conference. The participation of NASPA is welcomed, especially in light of a rebirth of legal controversy surrounding certain aspects of student-institution relationships. Stetson and its co-sponsors believe that this joint sponsorship, and the resulting interprofessional discussion of current legal issues, makes this conference an important event for the higher education community.

## THE CONFERENCE PROGRAM

We are pleased to announce that our keynote speaker for the 1984 conference will be Wm. Reece Smith, Jr., former President of the American Bar Association, and former university president. An inspiring speaker, Mr. Smith has represented American lawyers throughout the world. His complementary leadership role in the higher education community makes him uniquely qualified to comment upon the current legal environment within which we must manage diverse — and in some instances controversial — educational programs.

Mr. Smith's keynote address will be followed by our traditional "Washington Roundtable" — a discussion of current judicial, legislative and regulatory issues by the Washington representatives of higher education. This year, the roundtable will include a discussion of significant pending issues regarding equal employment opportunity, led by Mr. Clarence Thomas, Chairman of the United States Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

The balance of the conference program will focus upon the most critical legal issues in academic, administrative, and student affairs in 1984. As in past years, the discussion of these issues will be led by a distinguished group of speakers, including lawyers, administrators, and governmental officials with expertise and experience in matters subsumed by the program topics. These experts will be available throughout the conference to insure opportunity for continuing and practical dialogue. Questions and answers will be a vital part of the conference. We invite your examination of the entire program, and we look forward to your participation in the 1984 conference.
