

ACADEMIC POSITIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1986-Present Acting Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs and Research, Connecticut State University (system), New Britain. The duties of this position include:

- Participating in and providing staff suppport to the Council of Vice Presidents for Academic Affairs.
- Participating in and providing staff suppport to the Council of Deans of Students.
- Preparing the annual budget for the Office of Academic Affairs and Research.
- Serving on and providing staff support to the University's Basic Skills Council and its writing and mathematics subcommittees.
- Making recommendations to the Vice President regarding the development of a system-wide Academic Facilities Planning process.
- Coordinating the development of the long-range plans for academic computing.
- Managing the publication of all documents prepared and distributed by the Academic Affairs area, including recruiting materials, reports, "fact books," etc.
- Representing the CSU system on the Connecticut Board of Governors' Committee to Ensure Minority Student Access to and Retention in Institutions of Higher Education, the Special Advisory Committee on Licensure and Accreditation, and the Special Advisory Committee on Assessment.
- Coordinating the planning committee for the annual system-wide conference on academic computing.

ACADEMIC POSITIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES (Continued)

1970-1986 Faculty Member (Professor since 1982, tenure granted 1974), Department of Psychology, Central Connecticut State University, New Britain. (On leave since September, 1986.)

Courses Taught: General Psychology, Psychological Statistics, Experimental Psychology, Sensation and Perception, Cognitive Psychology, Computer Applications in the Behavioral Sciences, and Research Methods in Community Psychology. Additionally, several workshops for faculty and staff in various computer applications.

Committee Service:

- Curriculum Committee: Served as Secretary of the Committee and as Chairman of the General Education Subcommittee. During this period, the General Education Subcommittee developed the "Modes of Thought" general education program which achieved national recognition.
- Alcohol Task Force: Chaired this committee which revised the University's policies regarding the use of alcohol on campus.
- Computer Facilities Committee: A founding member of this committee which was formed in 1973. It has subsequently substantially aided the University in its transformation to a state-of-the-art campus in the academic use of computers.
- 1967-1970 Graduate Research Assistant, Sensory Psychology Laboratory, Department of Psychology, Tulane University, New Orleans.
- 1966 Research Technician, Neurophysiology and Behavior Laboratories, Delta Regional Primate Center of Tulane University, Covington, Louisiana.

1977-1981: Consultant for data collection and analysis. Long Lane Supplemental Education Project (a program designed to bring Connecticut's facility for adjudicated juvenile offenders into compliance with state and federal regulations regarding special education).

- 1981-1984: Project Evaluator for an interdisciplinary project to train law students and practicing attorneys in areas of special education and related services.
- 1984-1986: Project Evaluator for the Sci-Math Project (a program to improve the teaching of mathematics in the high school curriculum).
