

## RESOLUTION

## ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ENTREPRENEURIAL SUPPORT CENTER

at

CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY

March 3, 1989

- WHEREAS, The School of Business at Central Connecticut State University has a diverse and highly qualified faculty with professional skills appropriate to assist in the development of small business enterprises, and
- WHEREAS, The interaction of the School of Business faculty and students with state and local government personnel, with chambers of commerce and trade association personnel, and with business entrepreneurs to assist with the development of new or growing enterprises can strengthen faculty professional expertise and provide valuable learning opportunities for students, and
- WHEREAS, Instruction, research, and public service in support of the state's economy are appropriate activities within the mission of the University, and
- WHEREAS, An Entrepreneurial Support Center in the School of Business at Central Connecticut State University has been funded by Special Act of the Connecticut General Assembly, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of Connecticut State University authorizes the establishment of the Entrepreneurial Support Center in the School of Business at Central Connecticut State University, and be it
- RESOLVED, That the function of the Entrepreneurial Support Center shall be to facilitate the use of faculty and student professional knowledge in cooperation with other professional and technical experts to assist in the development of small business enterprise in Connecticut, and be it
- RESOLVED, That the Entrepreneurial Support Center shall be under the supervision and administration of a Director who shall be responsible to the Dean of the School of Business at Central Connecticut State University, and be it



RESOLVED, That the Entrepreneurial Support Center may receive payment for its services and may seek and receive grants and other funding provided that all such income is deposited in university accounts established for the Center and used exclusively for Center purposes and appropriate University administrative support functions, and be it

RESOLVED, That the President of Central Connecticut State University shall cause the Entrepreneurial Support Center to be evaluated by qualified persons and shall no later than September 1, 1992, report the results of this evaluation to the President of Connecticut State University who shall in turn share the evaluation with the Board of Trustees, and be it

RESOLVED, That the Entrepreneurial Support Center shall go out of existence no later than December 31, 1992, unless action is taken to the contrary by the Board of Trustees of Connecticut State University.
