RESOLUTION

concerning

FEE SCHEDULE AND REFUND POLICY

July 19, 1996

- WHEREAS, Pursuant to the provisions of Section 10a-99 of the Connecticut General Statutes, "...the Board of Trustees of the Connecticut State University System shall fix fees for tuition and shall fix fees for such other purposes as the board deems necessary at the university, and may make refunds of the same," and
- WHEREAS, This policy has been discussed with various system constituencies and takes into consideration their views, and
- WHEREAS, This policy complies with provisions of Public Law 102-325, Section 484B of the Higher Education Amendments relative to students receiving Title IV Student Financial Assistance as administered by the Federal Department of Higher Education, and
- WHEREAS, This policy incorporates the Housing Cancellation fee approved by the Board in June 1996, into the Student Fee and Refund policy and spells out in greater detail how this policy is to be applied by the universities, and
- WHEREAS, The continuing Student Fee Schedule and Refund policy items contained in Board Resolutions 89-89, 93-3, and 94-12 are incorporated into this policy, therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Fee Schedule and Refund Policy set forth in the attachment to this resolution is effective for Academic Year 1996-97, and be it further
- RESOLVED, That Board Resolutions 89-89, 93-3, and 94-12 are rescinded.

FEE SCHEDULE AND REFUND POLICY

NEW STUDENTS (first-time/full-time and first-time/part-time matriculated)

Refund Policy for Students Receiving Title IV Student Financial Assistance

All first semester students who are receiving assistance under Title IV and withdraw from a CSU University shall be refunded under the provisions of Public Law 102-325, Section 484B of the Higher Education Amendments as administered by the Department of Education as follows;

- a) In accordance with Federal regulations, a refund will be made to a student attending the institution for the first time and is receiving assistance under Title IV, of that portion of paid tuition, fees, room and board less non-refundable deposits, binders, and sickness insurance which is proportional to the weeks of the semester remaining (measured from the week of withdrawal) compared to the total weeks in the semester. These rules also apply to first-time/full-time and first-time/part-time matriculated students who are suspended or expelled from the university.
- b) From the point where 60% of the semester has passed no refund will be made.

- No refund will be made after the fourth week.

Housing Cancellation Fee

Fall Semester and Spring Semester

- Upon withdrawal from a residence hall three to four weeks before classes begin, a 10% housing cancellation fee based upon the housing fee after deducting the housing deposit will be assessed.
- During the first and second weeks prior to the commencement of classes, a 20% housing cancellation fee based upon the housing fee after deducting the housing deposit will be assessed.

Food Service Fee

Fall Semester not later than August 1

Spring Semester not later than January 2

 Refundable, on a prorated basis upon withdrawal from university housing or the university. Full weeks will be used to prorate.

Housing Cancellation Fee - Less Housing Deposit

Fall Semester and Spring Semester

- Upon withdrawal from a residence hall three to four weeks before classes begin, a 10% housing cancellation fee based upon the housing fee after deducting the housing deposit will be assessed.
- During the first and second weeks prior to the commencement of classes, a housing cancellation fee of 20% will be assessed.
- No refunds will be made after the beginning of classes.

Food Service Fee

Fall Semester

not later than August 1

Spring Semester

not later than January 2

Refundable, on a prorated basis, upon withdrawal from university housing or the University. Full weeks will be used to prorate.

Extension and Summer/Winter Course Fees

Fall and Spring Semesters

- 100% refund through the first week of classes.
- 50% refund during the second and third weeks of classes.
- No refund after the third week of classes.

Summer/Winter Sessions

- 100% refund prior to the second class meeting.
- 50% refund prior to the third class meeting.
- No refund after the third class meeting.

Refunds of Tuition and Fees under Unusual Circumstances.

Under circumstances beyond the control of the student or in cases where attendance has been denied by the University, the University President may authorize the refunding of fees otherwise designated as non-refundable.

*All refunds will be made automatically upon formal withdrawal from a University.
