Students complete a two-part general education curriculum: Part I (Foundations) addresses lifelong learning in and through 10 competencies. Part II (Exploration) requires students to complete a minimum of 40 credits outside their major. Students must also repeat three different competencies, excluding writing and first-year navigation.

In the Framework30 portion of the transfer degree, students who complete a TAP degree will receive credit for having met 8 competencies in Foundations, including at least one repeat (Scientific Inquiry), and 30 of the 40 credits of Explorations.


